The workshops aim to reduce anxiety and





perceived pain, improve self-confidence, provide a sense of control and autonomy, and create space for social connection, aligning with the goals of the Whole Health program.

As Alaska has the nation's highest per capita population of veterans, and between 12-15% have been diagnosed with PTSD, ACA's project is an essential resource for the community.
